#### **Catholic Ethos**



#### **The School Curriculum**

It is the policy of the Board of Governors of St. Malachy's Primary School that all the pupils receive their full entitlement under the Northern Ireland Curriculum and that the school go beyond that entitlement in areas where there are particular abilities among the staff.

The School provides a balanced and broadly based curriculum promoting the spiritual, moral, cultural, intellectual, physical and social development of the pupils. This curriculum will seek to prepare the pupils for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of adult life. It is also the aim of the school to maximise the potential of each pupil, to develop self-confidence in the pupils and to promote a spirit of tolerance towards others.

The curriculum promotes children's self-esteem by concentrating on activities and learning experiences which encourage confidence, curiosity and creativity. It encourages children to take an active responsibility for their own learning.

#### ICT

Using Information and Communication Technology (UICT) is one of the three statutory cross-curricular skills of the Northern Ireland Curriculum.

In 2016 St Malachy's was one of only ten schools in N. Ireland to be awarded the Digital School of Distinction. The school was highly commended on the provision of ICT throughout the school and how well ICT was integrated into the curriculum to support teaching and learning. All classes have the use of the latest technology in interactive whiteboards, computers, laptops, and access to iPads. As part of the school's E Safety Policy our cartoon mascot 'Tony the Cyber Tiger' promotes safe attitudes to online use, both in school and at home.

As part of ICT provision, the school offers a Coding Afterschool Club. This provides pupils with the opportunity to work with software such as Scratch, Sphero SPRK+ and Drones. During this time, children solve problems using algorithm, demonstrating their creativity in developing simple interactive games. In doing so, they develop skills that are essential in the technologically advanced world in which we live.

We have recently achieved national success in 2 Minecraft competitions, coming first place overall in the United Kingdom and third place overall in Northern Ireland.

#### **Music Provision**



## St Malachy's has a proud music tradition and is fortunate to have the services of EA music tutors on a weekly basis.

Children in P5-7 receive EA music tuition in a selection of brass and woodwind instruments. We provide this service for free. Pupils also can learn to play the tin whistle and sing in the school choir, which performs at both school and community events. Our school choir takes part in the Schools' Singing Programme hosted by the Archdiocese of Armagh and the annual inter-denominational Carol Service.







#### PE

In our school we place a great emphasis on the teaching of PE and Sport, both within the normal curriculum and as an extra-curricular activity. All classes take part in at least 2 PE sessions per week taught by their class teacher or a specialist coach.

Through the range of activities, we make available to our pupils we aim to give them opportunities to develop:

- The skills associated with these activities
- Enjoyment in participating
- An awareness that taking an active part in sport could lead to a healthier lifestyle

In the summer term, all classes participate in our annual Sports Day.

#### **Homework**

We recognise the importance of parental support in the education of our children. Homework is an integral part of every pupil's learning and an opportunity for parents to become involved in their children's learning and progress. It reinforces the learning done in school and is an excellent home/school link.

Children also need time for recreation and the development of their own interests so homework is assigned Monday to Thursday.

#### **Assessment and Reporting**

Detailed monitoring of pupils' progress takes place throughout the school year, both formally and informally. This information is discussed with parents at parent/ teacher meetings held at the beginning of the spring term. An end of year written report is issued in June. Parents are encouraged to play an active role in their child's education and appointments can be made to discuss progress with the class teacher at any mutually agreed time.



#### **Religious Education**

Religious Education will be available to all children at St. Malachy's Primary School. The Religious Education of pupils will be accomplished in two equally important and complementary ways.

- Through the totality of experiences in the school
- Through the religious education programme

Staff are aware of the spiritual needs of the children and the important part Religious Education plays in a child's upbringing. The Grow in Love programme is the core resource for the teaching of RE, linking the home and school in the task of handing on the faith to the children.

The school chaplain is a regular guest in the school, visiting all classes and assisting the respective class teachers in the preparation of children for First Communion and Confirmation.

Parents of children from a non-Catholic background can contact the school regarding religious instruction.







#### **Special Educational Needs**

At our school, we are committed to providing an inclusive and supportive learning environment where every child can thrive. We recognise that some pupils may require additional help to reach their full potential, and we work closely with parents, carers, and external agencies to ensure individual needs are met. Our dedicated staff implement a wide range of provisions within the school including withdrawal for interventions, Sensory Motor Group and access to programmes such as Nessy and Dynamo Maths as well as a Sensory Motor Room. Where further assistance is required, we work in collaboration with external agencies such as the Education Authority, Health and Social Care Trusts, and Local Impact Teams (LITs), which provide targeted support and guidance. Through early identification and personalised learning plans, we aim to remove barriers to learning and celebrate the unique strengths of every child. We value strong partnerships with parents and carers and keep you involved every step of the way. Together, we aim to create an inclusive environment where every child can thrive academically, socially, and emotionally.

## Pastoral Care and Child Protection

At St Malachy's, pastoral care permeates all aspects of school life. It reflects the values, attitudes, beliefs and practices of our Catholic faith and involves all members of the school community-children, parents, teachers and all other adults who contribute to the overall well-being of each child. Each teacher works very hard to create and maintain a caring and supportive environment in which all pupils can develop as person, as well as a learner.

All Primary I children are assigned a P7 'Buddy' to be their friend and mentor throughout their first year at St Malachy's. This reinforces the ideas of friendship and responsibility and helps the younger children to become more comfortable at school.

#### **Child Protection**

The school follows the Education Authority's recommended procedures for Safeguarding and Child Protection. Copies of the school's Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy and Anti-Bullying policy are available on the school website.

#### **Behaviour**

The school adopts a positive attitude to discipline, based on respect for self, respect for other pupils and respect for adults. A copy of the school Positive Behaviour Policy outlining the school rules, rewards and consequences of undesirable behaviour, is available to parents. It is based on a sense of community within the school and values which all of its members share. The support and co-operation of parents is a very important element in achieving the aims in our Positive Behaviour Policy.

## Extra Curricular Activities

St Malachy's is aware of the importance of visits and other enrichment activities in the development of our children. These form a key part of the children's education and are usually closely linked with class topics.

### Breakfast and After Schools Club

We offer a welcoming Breakfast Club each morning from 8:00am-8:45am, providing a healthy start to the day with a nutritious breakfast and a calm environment before lessons begin. Our Afterschool Club runs from 2pm until 5:30pm offering a safe, enjoyable space for children to relax and take part in a range of activities. These include support with homework, arts and crafts, games and sport. Healthy snacks are provided to keep children energised throughout the session. Both clubs are supervised by caring staff and designed to support families by offering flexible, affordable childcare in a familiar and friendly setting.

#### **Parental Involvement**

It is our aim to involve parents in the education of their child and to keep them as fully informed as possible. We host a range of workshops to inform and support parents including E-Safety. Parents are kept up-to-date through the school website, the school App, seesaw and Facebook. They are also kept informed of workshops organised by outside agencies such as Parentline NI and RISE NI.

The school has a strong enthusiastic and hard-working team of parents who sit on the Parent-Teacher Association. They organise various fund raising events through the school year, which raise much appreciated funds for the school and work to support the school and enrich the educational experience for pupils. They also act as a link between parents and the school, fostering a strong sense of community.



#### **Pupil Voice**

Pupils are given a voice through the School Council that is elected annually with representatives from P4-7. The Eco Council is also made up of representatives from P4 - P7, who mentor children from Foundation Stage and KSI, encouraging everyone to think about preserving and protecting our environment.

Our Digital Leaders are a dedicated team of pupils who promote safe and responsible use of technology across the school. They play a key role in delivering important internet safety messages to their peers and helping to create a positive digital environment for everyone.

We endeavour to extend the pupils' learning beyond the classroom, developing responsible attitudes and commitment to environmental issues both at home and in the wider community. In 2023 we were prizewinners in an NI Water conservation project.

#### **Community Links**

We value strong connections with local nursery schools to help children make a smooth and happy transition into primary education. Throughout the year, we invite nursery classes to join us for special sessions, such as Learning Through Play and PE Activities. We then visit nurseries in the summer term to meet our new pupils and invite them to a 'Stay and Play' session in their new PI classroom. These visits allow children to become familiar with our school environment, meet staff, and build confidence before starting PI. Our aim is to make the move from nursery to primary school a positive experience for every child.

## **Admissions Information**

Application for a place in PI can be sought in January of the year in which admission is required. The admissions criteria will be available to parents in advance of the application process.

Requests for places in P2–P7 classes will be considered, provided that the maximum enrolment number has not been reached and that additional enrolments will not significantly increase individual class numbers or exceed a maximum of 30 pupils in any Foundation Stage or Key Stage I class.

## Visiting the School

#### **Before Enrolment**

An open day will take place in December when parents have the opportunity to visit the school to experience the richness of St Malachy's and the talents that the children have to offer.

#### **Entrants to Primary 1**

In June the Primary I teacher visits
Nursery Schools to meet the children to
be admitted in September and to gather
any necessary information to make the
transition as smooth as possible. At the
end of the summer term, the children
are then invited to a Stay and Play
session where they have the opportunity
to see their classroom, meet their
teacher and peers as they sample some
of the activities available to them.

Entrants who have previously attended another school;

- An interview will be arranged with the Principal
- Parents will be welcome to view the school premises
- A meeting can be arranged with the prospective teacher/s of the child/ children




